The Open Combined Senior/Junior and Junior Doe show All show will be separately sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association. The Combined Senior/Junior doe show will be sanctioned for the following: LaMancha, Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, Saanen, Sable, AOP (Alpine/Oberhasli/Toggenburg) and Recorded Grades. For Junior Doe show the following breeds are sanctioned: Lamancha, Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, AOP and Recorded Grade. The Buck show will be sanctioned for Nigerian Dwarf, and AOP. Show order is subject to change with entries. ADGA Rules shall govern.

1. All goats must be in their stalls no later than 8:00 a.m., Saturday May 18, 2019. Exhibitors may arrive Friday, May 17, after 6 PM. Goats may be released following the end of their classes.
2. The Senior and Junior Doe and Buck show will be a 3 ring event, with separate sanctions for each ring's show.
3. Entry fee for one ring is \$7.00 per head if pre-registered or \$15.00 per head if registered after 5/10/2019. The entry fee for 2 rings is \$12.00 per head if pre-registered or \$20.00 if registered after 5/10/2019. The entry fee for all 3 rings is \$15.00 per head if pre-registered or \$25.00 if registered after 5/10/2019. Entry due date of 5/10/2019. There will be a \$3.00 per pen fee. Please use the SMDGA Show registration form. Entries are due by May 10, 2019. Payment must accompany entry form and is nonrefundable. **Mail entries to Ken Everett 9303 Hill Road, Knoxville, TN 37938.** You may email entries to Ken at [lflfarmer@yahoo.com](mailto:lflfarmer@yahoo.com). Then mail entry fee.
4. The Combined Senior/Junior Doe show will begin Saturday, May 18, at 9 AM EST in Ring 1. Each breed will proceed from Ring 1 to Ring 2 to Ring 3 in the same order. The Junior Doe Show will follow the completion of the Combined Senior/Junior Doe Show, and the Buck show will follow the completion of the Junior Doe Show.
5. All Exhibitors must be in possession of a certificate or statement from a licensed veterinarian dated within 30 days prior to the show date declaring the herd to be disease free and healthy. Anyone failing to present the required statement or certificate will not be allowed to show. Tennessee state health rules apply (a copy follows). **No animals with evidence of Caseous Lymphadenitis will be allowed on the premises.**
6. All exhibitors must provide care for their own animals at all times, and maintain their animals' pens in an acceptable manner. Feed, bedding, and all equipment needed will be the responsibility of each exhibitor.
7. Does/Bucks under 6 months of age may be shown with stamped duplicate application for registration. Original registration certificates are required on all goats 6 months or older.
8. There will be no preshow milkout.
9. No dogs allowed in barn.

**TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE  
REGULATORY SERVICES - ANIMAL HEALTH  
SUMMARY: LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS**

**I. GENERAL:**

A. All stalls, pens, chutes, etc. located on the grounds of fairs and exhibitions shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant approved by USDA, APHIS between each scheduled fair or exhibition.

B. All livestock (except poultry) which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification or sufficient description to identify each animal. Certificates for this purpose shall be valid for ninety (90) days from date of issue. (Tennessee livestock only – out-of-state certificates are valid for thirty (30) days from the date of issue)

C. No animal showing clinical signs of infectious or communicable disease shall be allowed to enter or remain on premises of fairs or exhibitions. It shall be the responsibility of the manager of each event to assure prompt removal of such animals.

## II. LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING WITHIN THE STATE OF TENNESSEE

[Certificates of Veterinary Inspection Valid for a Period of Ninety (90) Days]

### F. GOATS

(1) Goats imported into or through Tennessee shall be accompanied by an official health certificate and be in compliance with 0080-2-1-.02, and Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(2) Goats imported into Tennessee for immediate slaughter to an approved slaughter establishment or to an approved livestock market for sale to a slaughter establishment shall only be required to have a transportation document and be in compliance with Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.

(3) All registered breeding goats, goats that have been commingled with sheep, goats for exhibition and dairy goats that move within the state, including for change of ownership, shows, fairs, expositions or slaughter shall be permanently, individually identified by a method approved in Title 9, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 79.1 through 79.4.
